The Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) degree is an Associate of Science degree consisting of 74 credit hours. The primary function of the PTA program is to produce educated, well trained individuals who possess the attitudes and values consistent with the highest ethical practice standards in the field of physical therapy. Graduates of the PTA program are eligible to take the National Physical Therapy Exam for Physical Therapy Assistants (NPTE-PTA). Successful completion of this exam results in state licensure as a Physical Therapist Assistant.

Successful completion of Phase I AND application to PTA program is required for consideration but does not guarantee access into Phase II. The program is competitive and limited in the number of students it may admit. Selection criteria is detailed in the application packet.

- Mail, fax, or hand deliver the application with supporting documents all to the Nursing and Health Sciences Department, Building 103, attention to PTA Program Coordinator.
- Applicants will be scheduled for and complete an interview with PTA Admission Committee.
- Within four weeks of the application due date, admission decision letters for the FGC PTA Program will be mailed to the students.
- Successfully complete a Mandatory New Student Orientation prior to the published deadline to maintain a seat in the program.
- Signup for and pass the Florida Civic Literacy Exam.
