THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SCHOLARSHIP 🚱



Criteria:

- Be a senior at a public school in FGC's service region.
- A cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher is required to apply.
- 500-word essay that follows the topics.
- 2 letters of recommendation. (Non-family member).
- A copy of HS Transcripts or Report card.
- Students must complete the 26-27 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at studentaid.gov.

Award:

- Scholarship can only be used at Florida Gateway College (FGC).
- \$4,959.36 for 2 years (\$1239.84 per semester for 4 consecutive semesters).
- Receive an FGC mentor.
- Final HS transcripts will be required before the scholarship award can be placed on a student account.

Scholarship Selection Process:

- Scholarship applications open October 1st.
- Completed applications must be submitted before or on March 2nd.
- All <u>completed applications</u> submitted on or before the deadline will be brought before the Committee.
- The Committee will then review each submitted application.
- Selection of recipients by the committee will be made before May 15th.
- FGC officials will notify winners.

Note on the Committee:

The scholarship selection committee consists of a diverse group of FGC faculty and staff from various departments and roles across campus. The committee includes individuals from different academic disciplines. administrative units, and student services, all dedicated to an equitable selection process. The committee follows a standard scoring rubric for scholarship applications. Each member scores each application, the scores are aggregated and the overall score is determined for the applicant.

Final Check:

- \square 500-word essay that follows the topics.
- □ 2 letters of recommendation (nonfamily member).
- ☐ A copy of HS Transcripts or Report card.
- Complete 26-27 FAFSA.

Not have a typed name!



Essay Criteria:

Explain in a 500-word essay why you should be considered for the BOT scholarship by addressing your academic success, extracurricular engagement or hobbies, future goals, and resiliency in overcoming a challenge.

- Academic Success: Describe an academic accomplishment that demonstrates your ability to succeed. Examples may include high achievement scores, challenging coursework, or academic awards
- Extracurricular Engagement or Hobbies: Describe an activity outside the classroom that illustrates your engagement with the broader community. Examples may include a leadership position, a job, community involvement or service, athletics, clubs, and more.
- <u>Future Goals:</u> Describe how receiving the BOT scholarship will assist you with achieving your future goals. Examples may include how this will assist you with accomplishing your future career path or any goals associated with your future
- **Personal Challenge or Community Impact:** Describe a personal challenge or obstacle you have faced, such as financial, medical, family, or educational difficulties, that demonstrates your perseverance and determination; or describe a time when you persevered through a difficult situation or made a meaningful impact on your community. What motivated you, and what did you learn from the experience?
